Course Description

The subject of start-up dos and don'ts has been among the most requested CPE/CLE topics from conference attendees. The purpose of this presentation is to leverage the experience and expertise of experts to identify steps to take and pitfalls to avoid when starting up a business. This course will be useful for all business types, including service firms, and intended for individuals serving start-ups as well as individuals starting their own business and requires no prior experience in starting up a business or serving start-ups. This course is not comprehensive and will not address all aspects of starting up a business. Instead, it will briefly touch on basic items from the following categories. To address as many items of each category as possible, the panel discussion has been split into two Parts. Aspects of each category might be addressed during both Parts but the categories will be the focus of the Parts, I or II, as noted. Part II categories: (a) Legal Entity and Formation, (b) Income Taxes, (c) Human Resources, (d) Compensation, (e) Operations, and (f) Technology.
